**MALBOROUGH:** Originally chartered by the King of England in 1757 and named “New Marlborough” after the Duke of Marlborough. Charter expired and chartered by New Hampshire Grants in 1761.

**MIDDLEBURG:** Chartered in the New Hampshire Grants in 1761. It received its name due to geographical location: half way between New Haven and Salisbury... The town was first settled in 1766 and most of the town burned to the ground in 1776 in what is now called the Carleton’s Raid.
