Steuben County, NY, was named after Baron Von Steuben, a German General who fought with Colonists in the American Revolution. Steuben County was split off from Ontario County in 1796. Steuben was first reduced in size in 1923 to form parts of Yates County. Steuben was further reduced in size in 1854 creating parts of Chemung, Tompkins and Schuyler Counties
